OPENING HYMN

THE GREETING

In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. All: Amen.

The Lord be with you All: and also with you.

PRAYERS OF PENITENCE

One of the following, or other seasonal words, will introduce the prayer of confession:

My brothers and sisters,

as we prepare to celebrate the presence of Christ

in word and sacrament,

let us call to mind and confess our sins.

or

God so loved the world that he gave his only Son Jesus Christ to save us from our sins, to be our advocate in heaven, and to bring us to eternal life.

Let us confess our sins in penitence and faith, firmly resolved to keep God's commandments and to live in love and peace with all.

All: Almighty God, our heavenly Father,

we have sinned against you and against our neighbour

In thought and word and deed,

through negligence, through weakness,

through our own deliberate fault.

We are truly sorry and repent of all our sins.

For the sake of your Son Jesus Christ, who died for us, forgive us all that is past and grant that we may serve you in newness of life to the glory of your name. Amen.

Almighty God, who forgives all who truly repent, have mercy upon you, pardon and deliver you from all your sins, confirm and strengthen you in all goodness, and keep you in life eternal; through Jesus Christ our Lord.

All: Amen.

GLORIA IN EXCELSIS

Words may vary slightly if a musical setting is used. On some occasions a metrical / hymn version of the Gloria may be sung.

All: Glory to God in the highest,

and peace to his people on earth.

Lord God, heavenly King, almighty God and Father,
we worship you, we give you thanks,
we praise you for your glory.

Lord Jesus Christ, only Son of the Father, Lord God, Lamb of God, you take away the sin of the world: have mercy on us; you are seated at the right hand of the Father: receive our prayer.

For you alone are the Holy One, you alone are the Lord, you alone are the Most high, Jesus Christ, with the Holy Spirit, in the glory of God the Father. Amen.

(we remain standing)

A brief period of silent prayer is concluded with

The Liturgy of the Word

READING (we sit)

One or two readings from scripture precede the Gospel reading.

At the end of each reading

Reader: This is the word of the Lord.

All: Thanks be to God.

GRADUAL HYMN / SONG

(we stand)

GOSPEL READING

(we remain standing)

When the Gospel is announced

The Lord be with you All: and also with you.

Hear the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ

according to N.

All: Glory to you, O Lord.

At the end of the Gospel reading

Reader: This is the Gospel of the Lord.

All: Praise to you, O Christ.

SERMON / REFLECTION

(we sit)

THE CREED

(we stand)

All: We believe in one God,

the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen.

We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ,

the only Son of God,

eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light,

true God from true God, begotten, not made,

of one Being with the Father;

through him all things were made.

For us and for our salvation
he came down from heaven,
was incarnate from the Holy Spirit
and the Virgin Mary and was made man.
For our sake he was crucified
under Pontius Pilate;
he suffered death and was buried.
On the third day he rose again
in accordance with the Scriptures;
he ascended into heaven
and is seated at the right hand of the Father.
He will come again in glory
to judge the living and the dead,
and his kingdom will have no end.

We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son, who with the Father and the Son is worshipped and glorified, who has spoken through the prophets.

We believe in one holy catholic and apostolic Church.
We acknowledge one baptism for the forgiveness of sins.
We look for the resurrection of the dead, and the life of the world to come. Amen.

PRAYERS OF INTERCESSION

(we sit or kneel)

This, or another suitable, response may be used during the prayers:

Lord, in your mercy,

All: hear our prayer.
At the end Merciful Father,

All: accept these prayers for the sake of your Son,

our Saviour Jesus Christ. Amen.

The Liturgy of the Sacrament

THE PEACE (we stand)

One of the following, or other suitable words, may be used to introduce the Peace.

Christ is our Peace.

He has reconciled us to God, in one body by the cross.

We meet in his name and share his peace.

or

We are the body of Christ.

In the one Spirit we were all baptised into one body.

Let us then pursue all that makes for peace and builds up our common life.

or

Blessed are the peacemakers: they shall be called children of God. We meet in the name of Christ and share his peace.

The peace of the Lord be always with you

All: and also with you.

Let us offer one another a sign of peace.

You are invited to exchange a sign or gesture of peace with those around you, saying the words, "The Peace of the Lord be with you", to one another.

OFFERTORY HYMN / SONG

During the offertory hymn members of the congregation may carry forward the gifts of bread and wine to be offered, blessed and received at the altar.

People's gifts of money are also collected and offered to God. Visitors may like to use the GIFT AID envelopes, filling in the required details as shown, so as to make their giving tax-efficient. If you would like to know more about regular giving to the church, contactless giving, and /or giving directly through your bank, then please do ask one of our church officers after the service.

THE PREPARATION OF THE TABLE AND THE TAKING OF THE BREAD AND WINE

One of the following prayers may be used.

Blessed are you, Lord God of all creation: through your goodness we have this bread to set before you,

which earth has given

and human hands have made.

It will become for us the bread of life.

All: Blessed be God for ever.

Blessed are you, Lord God of all creation:

through your goodness

we have this wine to set before you,

fruit of the vine and work of human hands. It will become for us the cup of salvation.

All: Blessed be God for ever.

or

Yours, Lord, is the greatness, the power, the glory, the splendour, and the majesty; for everything in heaven and on earth is yours.

All: All things come from you,

and of your own do we give you.

THE EUCHARISTIC PRAYER

One of the Church's Eucharistic Prayers will be used to give thanks for all God's gifts, for the gift of Christ's life, death and resurrection, and to bless the bread and wine we shall receive:

PRAYER A

The Lord be with you

All: and also with you.

Lift up your hearts.

All: We lift them to the Lord.

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

All: It is right to give thanks and praise.

It is indeed right, it is our duty and our joy, at all times and in all places to give you thanks and praise, holy Father, heavenly King, almighty and eternal God, through Jesus Christ your Son our Lord.

A Preface is used and the prayer continues...

... for ever praising you and saying / singing:

All: Holy, holy, holy Lord, God of power and might, (may be heaven and earth are full of your glory, hosanna in the highest.

Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord. Hosanna in the highest.

The prayer continues....

Great is the mystery of faith:

All: Christ has died;
Christ is risen;
Christ will come again.

or

Christ is the bread of life:

All: When we eat this bread and drink this cup, we proclaim your death, Lord Jesus, until you come in glory.

The prayer continues....

...in songs of everlasting praise:

All: Blessing and honour and glory and power be yours for ever and ever. Amen.

The service continues with the Lord's Prayer

or

PRAYER B

The Lord be with you

All: and also with you.

Lift up your hearts.

All: We lift them to the Lord.

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

All: It is right to give thanks and praise.

Father, we give you thanks and praise

through your beloved Son, Jesus Christ, your living Word,

through whom you have created all things;

who was sent by you in your great

goodness to be our Saviour.

The prayer continues...

...evermore praising you and saying / singing:

All: Holy, holy, holy Lord,

(may be God of power and might,

sung) heaven and earth are full of your glory,

hosanna in the highest.

Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord. Hosanna in the highest.

The prayer continues....

Great is the mystery of faith:

All: Christ has died;

Christ is risen;

Christ will come again.

or

Christ is the bread of life:

All: When we eat this bread

and drink this cup,

we proclaim your death, Lord Jesus,

until you come in glory.

The prayer continues...

...all honour and glory be yours, almighty Father, for ever and ever,

All: Amen.

The service continues with the Lord's Prayer

or

PRAYER H

The Lord be with you

All: and also with you.

Lift up your hearts.

All: We lift them to the Lord.

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

All: It is right to give thanks and praise.

It is right to praise you, Father, Lord of all creation; in your love you made us for yourself.

When we turned away you did not reject us, but came to meet us in your Son.

All: You embraced us as your children

and welcomed us to sit and eat with you.

In Christ you shared our life

that we might live in him and he in us.

All: He opened his arms of love upon the cross and made for all the perfect sacrifice for sin.

On the night he was betrayed, at supper with his friends he took bread and gave you thanks: he broke it and gave it to them, saying: Take, eat; this is my body which is given for you; do this in remembrance of me.

All: Father, we do this in remembrance of him;

his body is the bread of life.

At the end of supper, taking the cup of wine, he gave you thanks, and said:

Drink this, all of you; this is my blood of the new covenant, which is shed for you for the forgiveness of sins. Do this in remembrance of me.

All: Father, we do this in remembrance of him; his blood is shed for all.

As we proclaim his death and celebrate his rising in glory, send your Holy Spirit that this bread and this wine may be to us the body and blood of your dear Son.

All: As we eat and drink these holy gifts make us one in Christ, our risen Lord.

With your whole Church throughout the world we offer you this sacrifice of praise and lift our voices to join the eternal song of heaven:

All: Holy, holy, holy Lord, (may be God of power and might,

sung) heaven and earth are full of your glory,
Hosanna in the highest.

THE LORD'S PRAYER

All:

(we sit or kneel)

As our Saviour taught us, so we pray

Our Father in heaven,

now and for ever.

Amen.

hallowed be your name,
your kingdom come,
your will be done,
on earth as in heaven.
Give us today our daily bread.
Forgive us our sins
as we forgive those who sin against us.
Lead us not into temptation
but deliver us from evil.
For the kingdom, the power,
and the glory are yours,

THE BREAKING OF THE BREAD

We break this bread

to share in the body of Christ.

All: Though we are many, we are one body,

because we all share in one bread.

AGNUS DEI

The Agnus Dei may be said or sung, during which those in the sanctuary may receive communion. The words may vary slightly if sung.

All: Jesus, Lamb of God:

have mercy on us.

Jesus, bearer of our sins:

have mercy on us.

Jesus, redeemer of the world:

grant us your peace.

GIVING OF COMMUNION

Draw near with faith.
Receive the body of our Lord Jesus Christ which he gave for you, and his blood which he shed for you.
Eat and drink in remembrance that he died for you, and feed on him in your hearts by faith with thanksgiving.

or

God's holy gifts, for God's holy people.

All: Jesus Christ is holy,

Jesus Christ is Lord,

to the glory of God the Father.

You will be invited to come forward to receive the consecrated bread and wine of Communion. Any who do not ordinarily receive, or would rather not, and those children still to be prepared for Communion, are invited to come forward for a blessing.

During the distribution of communion, hymns / music may be played.

PRAYER AFTER COMMUNION

After all have received communion, the altar is cleared and a brief silence is kept before our final prayers.

A post communion prayer, set for the day, may be said.

All: Almighty God, we thank you

for feeding us with the body and blood of your Son Jesus Christ. Through him we offer you our souls and bodies

to be a living sacrifice.

Send us out in the power of your Spirit

to live and work

to your praise and glory.

Amen.

or

We thank you, Lord, that you have fed us in this sacrament, united us with Christ, and given us a foretaste of the heavenly banquet prepared for all peoples. Amen.

Notices may be given, Banns of Marriage be read and news shared.

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The Dismissal

We stand to receive God's blessing, in the form of one of the following. On occasions an alternative blessing may be chosen to link with a specific theme, or to mark a Saint's Day.

The peace of God, which passes all understanding, keep your hearts and minds in the knowledge and love of God, and of his Son Jesus Christ our Lord; and the blessing of God almighty, the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit, be among you and remain with you always. *All:* Amen.

Christ, who has nourished us with himself the living bread, make you one in praise and love, and raise you up on the last day; and the blessing of God almighty, the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit, be among you and remain with you always.

All: Amen.

or

The God of hope fill you with all joy and peace in believing; and the blessing of God almighty, the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit, be among you and remain with you always.

All: Amen.

FINAL HYMN

Go in the peace of Christ. *All:* Thanks be to God.

or

Go in peace to love and serve the Lord.

All: In the name of Christ. Amen.

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
